Surf Life Saving Australia has announced new Personal Protective Equipment rules to apply from 1st October 2016. Lifejackets will become compulsory for surfboat, surf ski and surfboard races in heavy surf conditions. Surf ski paddlers will also be required to wear helmets in heavy surf conditions – boat rowers have been wearing helmets in heavy surf conditions since 1st October 2014. These new rules do not apply to nipper board paddlers as their events are normally called off in heavy surf conditions. Below is the statement from SLSA.

"The Surf Life Saving Australia Board has accepted a Report into the use of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) in surf sports under conditions of heightened risk.

SLSA will commence a trial period where the lifejackets it has developed will be tested under competition conditions, using experienced surf sports athletes. These trials will be conducted in heavier surf conditions where heightened risk exists.

The lifejacket trials will be held for Surf Boat, Surf Ski and Malibu Board disciplines. Surf helmets will also be trialed in Surf Ski discipline. This follows the successful introduction of helmets into surf boat rowing in 2014.

During the 18 month trial and consultation period SLSA will, in collaboration with Bond University, continue to develop a surf hazard rating system aligned to these specific disciplines. The rating system will be used in any decision to deploy lifejackets. This development process is SLSA's response to a key recommendation of the coronial inquest into the death of Saxon Bird in 2010. The new lifejacket rules will come into effect on October 1, 2016, which allows for 18 months of trialing and consultation with our surf sport competitors.

This is consistent with the process adopted for the introduction of helmets in surf boat rowing which took place throughout 2014/2015.

"We have experienced three tragic deaths at the Australian Championships over a 17-year period, which is unacceptable to Surf Life Saving Australia. Surf Life Saving Australia has made a commitment to introduce lifejackets into surf sports across all craft events in conditions of heightened risk. The period of trialing and consultation is an important part of this journey" Surf Life Saving Australia Deputy President Ralph Devlin said.

"This has been a rigorous process. Safety is paramount for Surf Life Saving Australia. We are committed to balancing safety considerations with enjoyment of our sport. Our sport is a key element in making our lifesavers rescue ready across Australia."

The new lifejackets have been designed to minimise secondary risk, for example by allowing athletes to dive under broken waves and perform their activities unhindered. Crucially, the lifejackets will also ensure an incapacitated athlete will float to the surface in salt water and enhance any rescue efforts that are necessary.

"Trial and consultation for an 18-month period is designed to confirm that athlete safety is enhanced in conditions of heightened surf risk. We are talking about the combination of our risk assessment tool and the deployment of lifejackets for the improvement of athlete safety" said Mr Devlin

Surf helmets, for periods of heightened risk, will also be trialed in surf ski and IRB competition during the 18 month period."

Surf Life Saving Australia has also recommended all members use the approved safety devices during craft training sessions.

Gallipoli 100

What an absolutely amazing event to be a part of! It's hard to highlight on what has been such a remarkable event, over 5 years in the making, countless fundraisers, meetings and of course training.

The 2 day surf boat event, though not a race as we were constantly being reminded of, was extraordinary. The course ended up being shortened as the Gallipoli Peninsula was getting ready for shut down prior to the dawn service. Both days started out cold, windy and drizzling rain, but soon turned into blue skies and sunshine. The scenery was magnificent and the colour and clarity of the water indescribable. 26 boats took part, 5 from Turkey. The starts were staggered into 5 waves, with the hope of everyone finishing at roughly the same time. Day 2 ended at Brighton Beach, just south of Anzac Cove. All boaties were then able to walk along the beach to Anzac Cove, while the boats were rowed across. We were all given the opportunity to row out from Anzac Cove and reflect on what those who had come before us were about to embark upon. Oars were raised in tribute to all who served.

At 4am on the morning of April 25th, 2015, 26 surf boats slipped silently into the water off Gelibou Village. We were re-enacting the ANZAC landing. On the beach were over 4000 people. As we sat silently in the surf boat, waiting for our wave to row onto the beach, a light fog rolled in, a lone piper in the Cottesloe boat began piping, followed by the softly sung words of Waltzing Matilda; I still get goose bumps remembering it. We slowly rowed ashore, the phosphorous in the water leaving a green glow from every stroke, and collectively raised our oars in a minute's silence, a very proud and stirring moment. We sat on the beach for a full and all inclusive Dawn Service.

The experience of our time in Turkey, rowing the Dardanelles, touring the battlefields, re-enacting the ANZAC landing and participating in the dawn service is very difficult to put into words. This was a once in a life time event, and these memories will last forever.

Thank you to the Yamba G100 team, a great bunch of people who shared the journey with me, we will always have that bond.

Thanks to the Community who helped us fulfil the dream.

We remember them and we honour those who served before us.
