...from the DIRECTOR of EDUCATION and TRAINING

With the final proficiency test on Sunday 1st November, members are reminded to join the Members Portal to access important information, including on-line learning for "Skills Maintenance" (proficiencies). The following steps *should* make it easier for first time users:

- 1. Log in to Surf Life Saving Australia Members Porta, or set up your account. All you need is your name, date of birth and email address to set up you own account.
- 2. Select "Lifesaving Online"
- 3. Select "courses"
- 4. Select "Online Learning Now"
- 5. "Search" for "Skills Maintenance"
- 6. Select the modules you need to be proficient in, depending on which awards you hold
- 7. When finished, select "Personal Learning Plan" to print your certificates
- 8. Please hand these to Nicole in the office or to myself.

A reminder to all trainers and assessors to complete their Working with Children Check. If anyone needs help with this I can provide the steps to follow.

Also 4 First Aid courses (AID) are being run at Shelley Beach in Ballina on: 7/11; 19/12; 20/2; 16/4. Closing dates are 2 weeks before course begins but you would be wise to enrol (through the Yamba office) ASAP.

A SRC squad and Bronze squad have started training. Bronze training is 9.30am on Saturdays while the SRC trains 9am on Sunday mornings. Both groups will be training on Wednesday nights from 7 pm to about 9 pm. We plan to assess both squads on the last weekend in November so it is imperative that candidates attend training and that all swim pre-requisites have been completed.

Finally, FNC Branch Education Director, Geoff Horsey, and myself visited Palmers Island Public School last Thursday morning to address the students about safety in the surf. The students were welcoming and attentive, asking plenty of questions of us. We left confident that the students had learned important information about surf safety. Many thanks to Natashya Earle for facilitating this visit.

We are still in a foundling state and these additional equipments will greatly assist in spreading lifesaving further throughout our Province and the Philippines.


