# ... from the DIRECTOR of EDUCATION and TRAINING

The U/13 and U/14 nippers groups - who did the SRC before Christmas – are beginning to do a Radio Operators certificate during nippers on Sunday mornings. It is hoped to begin this course this Sunday, 24/1/2016 if Nippers are on.

A second Bronze Medallion squad is due to start on Sunday 31/1/2016, 9.30 am at the surf club. Candidates are asked to enrol at the surf club office at least a week in advance and to bring a 400 m pool swim time, signed by the timer, when they come to this first session. This squad will be trained by probationary trainer Andrew Cumberland who will be assisted by other qualified trainers.

Spinal Management Course - the branch are running a one day Spinal Management Course at Yamba clubhouse on Saturday 5th March 9am to 2pm. Anyone interested in doing the course must hold either the bronze medallion or their First Aid certificate. This course is only run once every 3 or 4 years at Yamba so if you are interested don't miss this opportunity. ## Life Members Lunch.


There was much laughter, sharing of stories and trips down memory lane as 15 Yamba SLSC Life Members got together at the clubhouse for lunch.
